- Build cooperation and teamwork

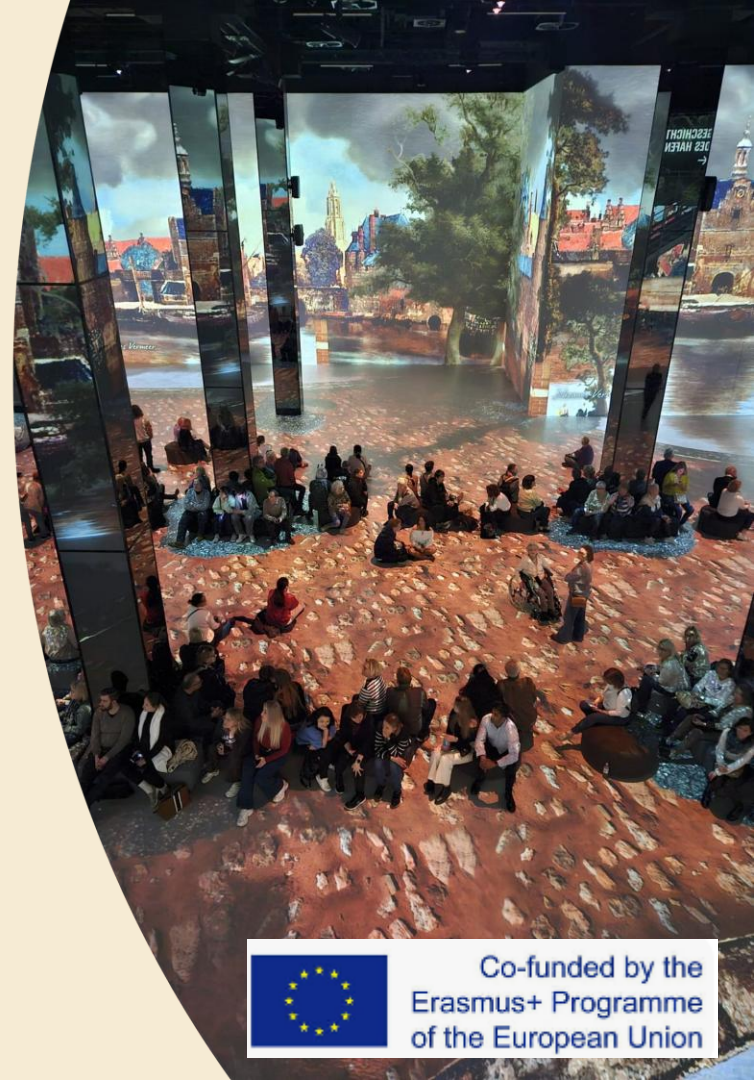
